The Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday is celebrated in a church which has been, as far as possible, stripped of adornment. We commemorate the Crucifixion and Death of the Lord and his being laid in the tomb. After the readings from Scripture, we pray in solidarity with the world he came to save; we venerate the wood of the Cross by coming forward to kiss the cross; and, before departing in silence, receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion, reserved from the night before. This is a holy day of fasting and abstinence. We try to keep the mood of the day by not going to entertainment, by eating little and by abstaining from meat and alcohol.

The Easter Fire is lit (as it is in the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem) and we enter the church by candlelight to hear the Proclamation of Easter (The Exultet). In the Light of the Resurrection we keep vigil as our salvation history is recited in readings from holy scripture, recalling how we came to be here. As the lessons come to the New Testament the lights are symbolically turned on and we sing the Gloria and Easter Alleluias, (which are not sung during Lent). Easter is the traditional time for celebrating baptisms and renewing our Baptismal Promises. We are sprinkled with Holy Water from the font to remind us of that joyful occasion when we were brought into the company of faith. In joy we come to receive our Easter Communion.
