The original name of this festival is the *Hypapante ('encounter') of our Lord Jesus Christ;* the meeting of our Lord with Simeon in the Temple. Bl. John Henry Newman, remarking on the subject of the reverence due to the Blessed Virgin, wrote "we … think of her with and for her Son, never separating her from Him, but using her name as a memorial of His great condescension in stooping from heaven and not 'abhorring the Virgin's womb'." (*Parochial and plain sermons*, 1868, vol. 2:136)

The name "Candlemas" is derived from the old practice of carrying lighted candles to Mass on this day, a reflection of the spiritual light of which Simeon spoke and in honour of the Virgin, the mother of the Light of the World.



GOSPEL

St Luke 2.22-40

At that time: When the days of Mary's purification, according to the law of Moses, were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord, as it is written in the law of the Lord: 'every male that openeth the womb shall be called holy to the Lord: and to offer a sacrifice according to that which is said in the law of the Lord, a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons.' And, behold, there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and the same man was just and devout, waiting for the

consolation of Israel, and the Holy Ghost was upon him. And it was revealed unto him by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ.
