He is currently studying the organ with Clive Driskill-Smith and has previously studied with Andrew Reid and Darius Battiwalla.

The Eucharist is the centre of the church's life only in the sense that it is really 'outside' the church, that it connects us with an energy of life that lies beyond our own resources.
