Meditation before Mass | from the writings of St Charles Borromeo (feast Mon 4 Nov) Indeed, we are like water, which, despite being cold, if placed above a fire, heats up, yet when we subtract the fire, or do not add wood to it continuously, rapidly returns, by itself, to its original coldness; in the same way, we too, cold as we are due to our corrupt nature, may warm up through the fire of charity, yet if this flame is not fed continuously, if we do not use opportune remedies, charity immediately becomes cooled and malice runs rampant. | If you should put together not just one sun and one world, but one thousand suns and one thousand worlds, your soul, O Christian, is far greater. | The first journey the Virgin Mary undertook led her to mountains and calamitous locations, yet she did not fail to proceed. If you, as a foreigner, know not the path that leads to your native land, ask Mary about it today.

## The Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING Isaiah 11.1-10

THUS SAITH THE LORD: There shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, **1** and a Branch shall grow out of his roots: and the spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD; and shall make him of quick understanding in the fear of the LORD: and he shall not judge after the sight of his eyes, neither reprove after the hearing of his ears: but with righteousness shall he judge the poor, and reprove with equity for the meek of the earth: and he shall smite the earth: with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips shall he slay the wicked. And righteousness shall be the girdle of his loins, and faithfulness the girdle of his reins. The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and the calf and the young lion and the fatling together; and a little child shall lead them. And the cow and the bear shall feed; their young ones shall lie down together: and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. And the sucking child shall play on the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the cockatrice' den. They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain: for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea. And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and his rest shall be glorious.

A T THAT TIME: The Pharisees went and took counsel how they might entangle him in his talk. And they sent out unto him their disciples with the Herodians, saying: 'Master, we know that thou art true, and teachest the way of God in truth, neither carest thou for any man: for thou regardest not the person of men. Tell us therefore, What thinkest thou? Is it lawful to give tribute unto Caesar, or not?' But Jesus perceived their wickedness, and said: 'Why tempt ye me, ye hypocrites? Shew me the tribute money.' And they brought unto him a penny. And he saith unto them: 'Whose is this image and superscription?' They say unto him: 'Caesar's.' #### Meditation | from a sermon preached at St Mary's by Bishop Rowan Williams

We are not saints by being different and being better by our own achievement. We are saints by God's gift freely given to all. We would like - being the human beings we are - to be able to say that our holiness does perhaps rest on something a bit different. But it's interesting how the Bible punctures that bubble again and again. Naaman the Syrian who comes to be healed by Elisha and is told: 'Go and jump into the river,' literally. And Naaman thinks: 'Surely there was something special I ought to have been doing?' And he has to be persuaded by his theologically very acute servants that doing something absolutely ordinary, and rather humiliatingly prosaic is exactly how you get healed by God. Similarly, the rich young man who comes to Jesus and wants to know what he's got to do to be saved, is told: 'You could start by keeping the commandments.' And he says rather irritably that of course he does that and Jesus says: 'In that case, simply stay in my company.' But that's not quite good enough. We would like it to be special: and actually it's ordinary. We would like the grace of God to be connected with our wonderful distinctiveness and unfortunately it's exactly the same for everybody. When we ask Jesus: 'What do we do now to be made whole?' what does he say? He says, 'Eat and drink. Do the most ordinary human things that there are. Do the things that unite you to every human being, past, present and future, and do it in my name and you will receive me.'
