OUR LORD JESUS did not establish a new Church or a new religion. He fulfilled the law and the prophets. After the resurrection, two disciples, walking on the road to the town of Emmaus, were speaking of their Lord's death. Jesus joined them. As they shared supper, Our Lord spoke of the Scriptures and how the Messiah fulfilled all the law and the prophets had prophesied.

St Paul says: 'Christ... loved the church, and gave himself for it.' How could Our Lord love and give his life for something which wasn't already in existence? Our Lord fulfilled the law and the commandments. He didn't construct a new idea, a new society. He merely continued the Church of the Old Testament, the Old Covenant, which prophesied his coming. He was a continuation of God's Chosen People and God's plan.

What in fact did Our Lord do? He reinterpreted the old rite of circumcision with the new Sacrament of Baptism, and thereby made the Church catholic. No longer were the faithful limited to the chosen People of Israel. Now the Church of God was open to all men of all nations through Holy Baptism, which becomes the only entrance to the Church. Our Lord said: 'Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.' ✨ *Raymond Raynes, CR, THE FAITH (1961 & 2012)* ✨ *Copies available in the porch*

LESSON

2 Chronicles 33.9-13

IN THOSE DAYS: Manasseh made Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem to err, and to do worse than the heathen, whom the LORD had destroyed before the children of Israel. And the LORD spake to Manasseh, and to his people: but they would not hearken. Wherefore the LORD brought upon them the captains of the host of the king of Assyria, which took Manasseh among the thorns, and bound him with fetters, and carried him to Babylon. And when he was in affliction, he besought the LORD his God, and humbled himself greatly before the God of his fathers, and prayed unto him: and he was intreated of him, and heard his supplication, and brought him again to Jerusalem into his kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the LORD he was God.

And when he cometh home, he calleth together his friends and neighbours, saying unto them: "Rejoice with me; for I have found my sheep which was lost."
