The departing Jesus does not make his way to some distant star. He enters into communion of power and life with the living God, into God's dominion over space. Hence he has not 'gone away', but now and forever by God's own power he is present with us and for us. In the farewell discourses of St John's Gospel, this is exactly what Jesus says to his disciples: 'I go away, and I will come to you' (St John 14.28). These words sum up beautifully what is so special about Jesus' 'going away', which is also his 'coming', and at the same time they explain the mystery of the Cross, the Resurrection, and the Ascension. His going away is in this sense a coming, a new form of closeness, of continuing presence. Through his power over space, Jesus is present and accessible to all-throughout history and in every place.
