INTROIT *Gaudeamus*

Psalm 45, &c.

Rejoice we all and praise the Lord, celebrating a holy day in honour of the Virgin Mary: for whose solemnity the angels are joyful, and glorify the Son of God. My heart is inditing of a goodly matter: I speak of the things which I have made unto the King.

LESSON

Zephaniah 3.14-18

THUS SAITH THE LORD: Sing, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel; be glad and rejoice with all the heart, O daughter of Jerusalem. The LORD hath taken away thy judgments, he hath cast out thine enemy: the king of Israel, even the LORD, is in the midst of thee: thou shalt not see evil any more. In that day it shall be said to Jerusalem, Fear thou not: and to Zion, Let not thine hands be slack. The LORD thy God in the midst of thee is mighty; he will save, he will rejoice over thee with joy; he will rest in his love, he will joy over thee with singing. I will gather them that are sorrowful for the solemn assembly.

Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep. Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.
