The Order of High Mass with the Ordinary texts is provided in the High Mass booklet. The setting of the Ordinary is the Missa Inclina cor meum by Philippe de Monte (1521-1603).

The introductory and concluding rites of the High Mass are altered for a Pontifical High Mass, as set out below, alongside the Propers (prayers, readings and verses) for the External Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.



THE RECEPTION OF THE BISHOP

Please stand as the Ministers go to the West Door. The Bishop of Fulham is received and presented with a crucifix, holy water and incense; the Antiphon 'Ecce sacerdos magnus' is sung. The Bishop vests at the altar of the Chapel of the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady; the Hymn 'O Sacred Heart' is sung.

LESSON Ezekiel 34.11-16




