And I believe in the Holy Ghost.' The central statement in the third section of the Creed speaks of 'God facing outward,' of the Holy Spirit as the power through which the risen Lord remains present in the history of the world as the principle of a new history and a new world. The remaining statements in the third section of the Creed are intended to be nothing more than developments of the basic profession, 'I believe in the Holy Ghost.' These developments proceed in two directions. First comes the phrase about the communion of saints; secondly, the phrase about the forgiveness of sins. Both statements are to be understood as concretisations of the words about the Holy Spirit, as descriptions of the way in which this Spirit works in history. The concluding words of the Creed, too, the profession of faith in the 'resurrection of the body' and 'life everlasting' are to be understood as the unfolding of faith in the Holy Spirit and his transforming power, whose final act they depict. GOSPEL St John 14.15-31

And now I have told you before it come to pass, that, when it is come to pass, ye might believe. Hereafter I will not talk much with you: for the prince of this world cometh, and hath nothing in me. But that the world may know that I love the Father; and as the Father gave me commandment, even so I do.'
